

## Fashion footnote

In the early 1930s, fashion designers took advantage of new fabrics to capture the folds and drapes that are characteristic of the era's couture. Of course, no man-made fabrics could live up to silk, but rayon dyed well and had a similar feel, so it was often used for lingerie and lower-end dresses and skirts. Wool crepe remained popular for the way it molded to the body and held pleats. Renowned designer Coco Chanel began using cotton around this time and changed the public's perception of that fabric from something used only for work clothes into a stylish option.

# Tech tip: *When was the last time you saw one of these?*

From the archives of Kentucky Utilities Company comes this photo of a 1931 Ford AA ice delivery truck.

These days, Kentucky Utilities Company is strictly an electricity provider. But years ago, the company also operated gas and water works, ice plants, transit services and appliance stores in many communities across the state.

The handwritten memo on the back of the original print states, “New Ford ice delivery truck in Lebanon. The sign, carried by the truck, is similar to those carried by all ice trucks during the special ice refrigerator activity.”

According to *The Legendary Model A Ford* by Peter Winnewisser, 513 such trucks were built between February 1931 and April 1932. The truck’s list price, F.O.B. Detroit, was \$735.

The truck’s pose here is strikingly similar to the illustration from an original advertisement for this model shown in Winnewisser’s book.

Among the interesting details in the photo — as well as in the ad illustration — is the indentation in the driver’s door, made necessary by the larger “Double-A” spare tire.

Also, note the unusual rear fenders. Could these have been unique to the ice delivery body? And although the

truck was new when the photo was taken, it appears that the driver’s side rear fender has already been scraped against something.
