Camp Nelson was established in 1863 as a depot for the Union army during the Civil War, and became a recruiting ground for new soldiers from eastern Tennessee and escaped slaves, many of whom trained there to be soldiers. After the war, Camp Nelson was a center for giving ex-slaves their emancipation papers, causing many of them to consider the camp as their "cradle of freedom."

From there, we'll tour to Wilmore for lunch at Fitch's country store. After lunch, we'll head to the Thomson-Hood Veterans Center to display our cars for the residents. They always enjoy seeing our cars, and it's a good opportunity for us to show our appreciation for their service to our country.




with any members who wish to join us there. Then we'll proceed to Louisville for lunch, followed by the Flavorman factory tour.
